Stephen Ministries

One: We have waited long enough!

All: For some, it has been a time of restless anticipation,

One: for others, a time of frenzied preparations.

All: For still others, a time of wearisome travel,

One: for some, a time of nostalgia, perhaps even melancholy.

All: But our time of waiting ends this night.

One: On the first Sunday of this blessed season,

All: We lit the Candle of Peace, reminding us that Jesus is the Prince of Peace, demonstrating how we can realize God's kingdom in this world.

One: On the second Sunday of this blessed season,

All: We lit the candle of Hope, celebrating the hope of Israel, and the hope we have in Jesus Christ.

One: On the third Sunday of this blessed season,

All: We lit the candle of Joy, giving thanks for the gift of Jesus who sets all people free.

One: On the fourth Sunday of this blessed season,

All: We lit the Candle of Love, declaring that Jesus was born into our world to show us how to love one another.

One: On this blessed eve of Christmas, we light the Christ Candle as a sign of the light of Christ which enters our world once again, fulfilling Isaiah's prophecy that

All: "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness, on them light has shined."

One: Allow that light to touch you, to heal your wounds, to renew your flagging spirit, to provide guidance for your journey.

All: Let us worship God on this holiest of nights.

*Invitation to Experience God's Grace

One: Ask and it will be given you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you.

All: For every one who asks receives, and the one who seeks finds, and to the one who knocks it will be opened.

One: Friends in Christ, God knows our needs before we ask, and in our asking prepares us to receive the gift of grace. Let us open our lives to God's healing presence, forsaking all that separates us from God and neighbor.

Let us be mindful not only of personal evil but also of our communal sins of family, class, race, and nation. Let us confess to God whatever has wounded us or brought injury to others, that we may receive mercy and become for each other ministers of God's grace.

*Laying Down Our Burdens

All: Dear Lord, we come to you this day to express our failures and confusion regarding our relationship with you:

You know that we come to you with heavy hearts that we find hard to unburden. It is particularly in this time of year when the darkness of long nights collides with the brilliance of Christmas lights, that we find it hard to express our losses.

We feel confused, sad, and lonely. We feel our losses without feeling your support for us. We tend even toward anger at you, Lord, because we feel in some way it is your will that we are unhappy.

Open us to the understanding that you are the source of all love and we need not feel so alone in our grief. Grant us wisdom to know that you—most of all—can be trusted, and that you are with us, especially when we are at our absolute worst.
