Hello Friends! Happy New Year! I hope you all had a wonderful holiday season. Welcome to 2022.



Johnsonburg provides ½, 1, 2 and 3 week summer camp programs for children, youth and families. Campers live in cabins, tents and lodges with campers of similar ages. Our main focus is on forming and living in community. Campers participate in camp activities including: archery, arts and crafts, bible study, boating, canoeing, challenge course, climbing wall, gaga ball, games, gardening, giant swing, high ropes, hiking, nature exploration, outdoor cooking, outdoor living skills, stand up paddle boarding, singing, swimming - lake and pool and worship.
