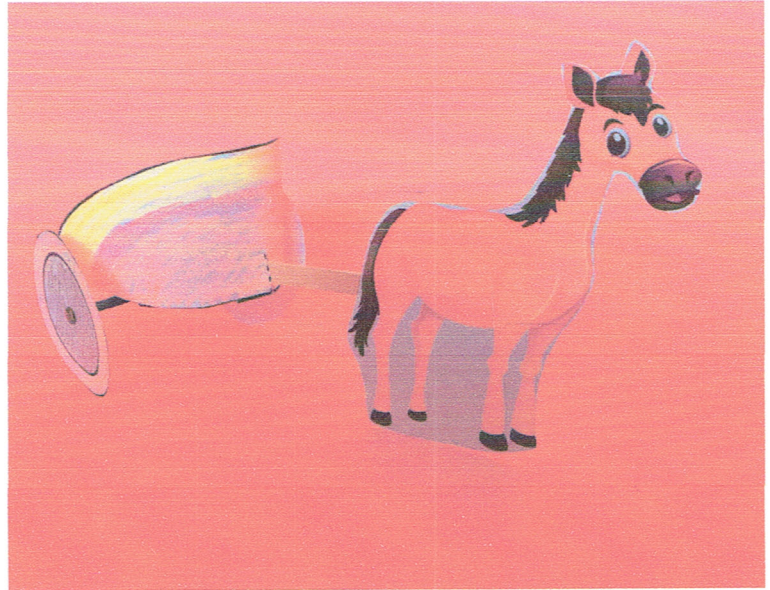
I hope you know how much you are loved and missed! We can't wait to be back at church together soon.

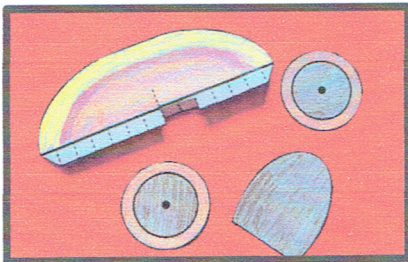
Chariot Craft

What you need

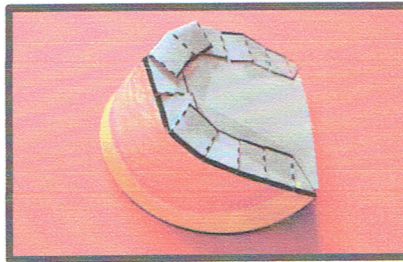
- Template
- White card
- Colouring pencils, crayons or paint.
- Sticky tape
- Glue
- Scissors
- 1 large straw and 1 narrow straw (or stick)
- 1 lollipop stick



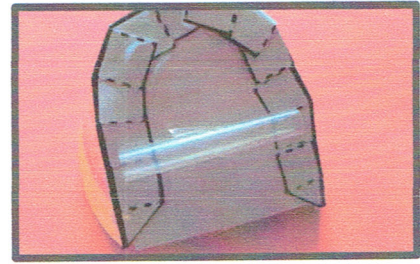
What to do



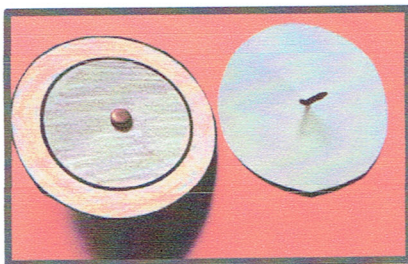
Print out the template onto white card, colour and cut



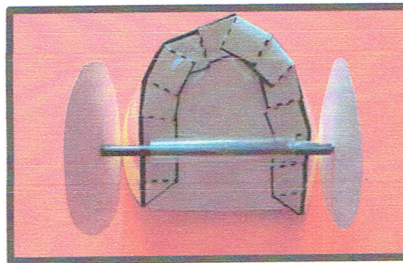
Fold flaps and glue to tape onto base section



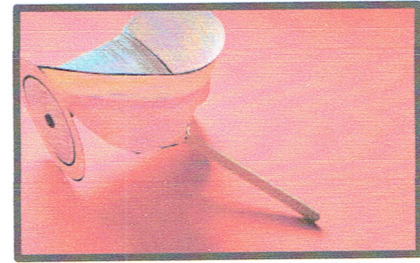
Tape the larger straw under the base



Insert fastener pins through the middle of each wheel.



Insert the smaller straw stick through the larger straw and attach a wheel onto each side using tape.



Insert a lollipop stick through the space in the front of chariot. Glue into place.

If you have extra time, you could add a toy horse to the chariot or the paper one that is provided on the following pages

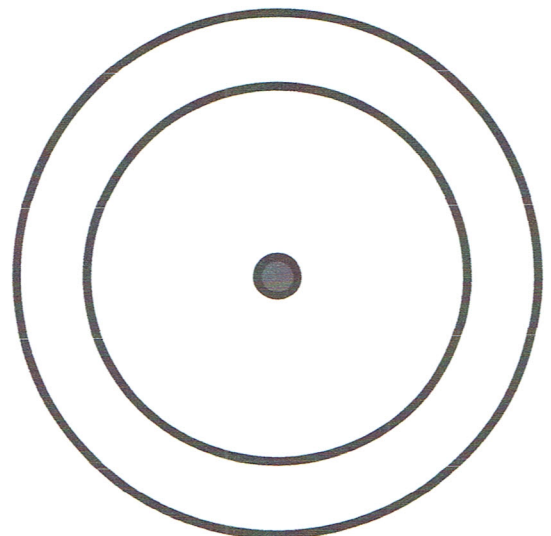
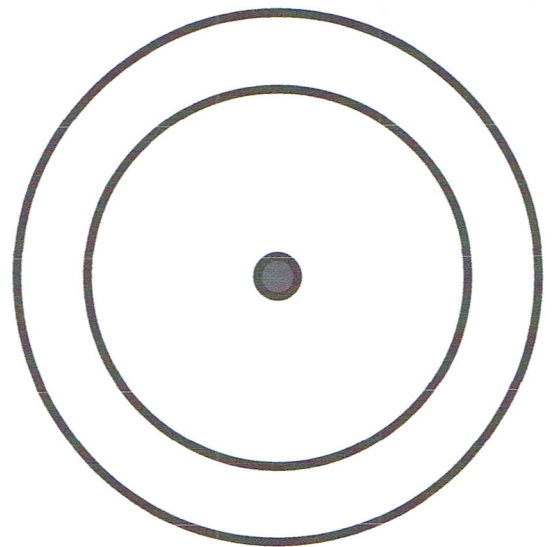
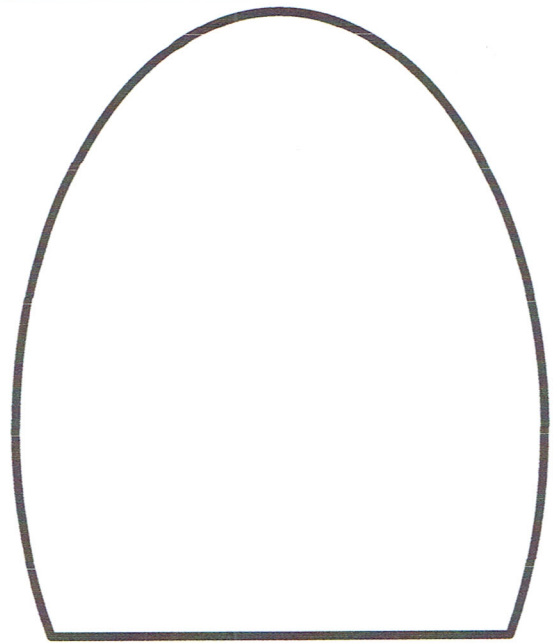
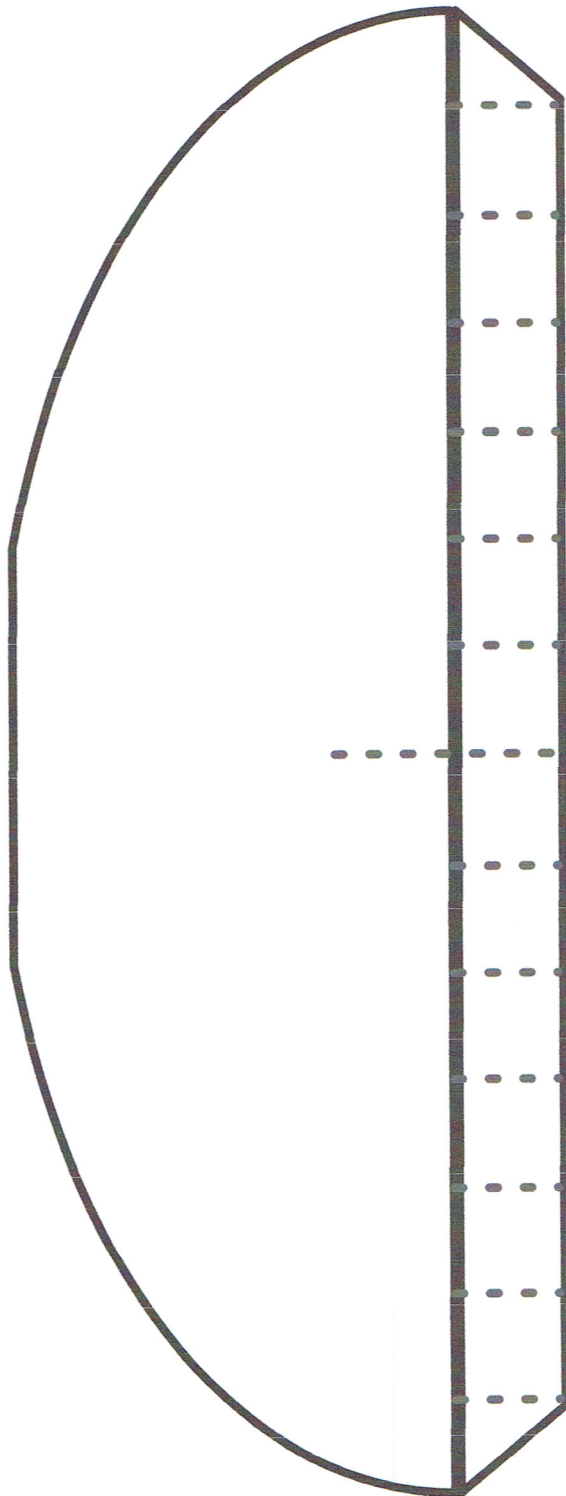
Print onto white card
