
This Week in Sunday School - The Annunciation and Advent Week 1 11.29.20


So, like Advent is the season of waiting and anticipation, we'll patiently wait until we can get together again. It's definitely something worth waiting for.


The Annunciation

What to do




Colour the pictures and cut out.




Glue stable scene back to back. Fold and glue.




For added stability, tape cardboard rings or small object to back of characters.







Angel Decoration
