## **Transparency**

In my conversations with members wherein I ask for feedback about life at the church in general, one of the consistent requests made is more transparency about Session decisions and deliberations. That same concern was raised at a recent meeting and the assembled elders asked that our Recoding Clerk, Paul Urian, prepare a short listing of salient actions for reporting to the congregation via the weekly email and Sunday bulletin. The good news is that practice begins today with this summary:



## Session Updates for Meetings on April 11 and April 25

## Regular Session Meeting on April 11, 2022

- The Chair and Asst. Chair of the PNC (Maggie Sell and Rebeca Silva de Foote respectively) attended the meeting in order to update Session on the progress the PNC is making and to make a request. Maggie reported that we are seeing far fewer candidates than we or the Presbytery expected. There are several possible reasons and the largest one is pay. The PNC asked for Session approval to increase the compensation we could offer. After a discussion, Session voted to approve a motion to have the Finance Committee research ways to pay for the additional costs and to report back to Session in a Called meeting on April 25th. At that meeting we will vote on whether to increase the salary of the position. Session shared their gratitude for the hard work the PNC has been doing to find a new Senior Pastor.
- The Governance Committee led by Lorraine Gormley-Devine presented 3 motions to make small changes in our by-laws to reflect changes in the way we operate. All three motions passed.
- The Property Committee led by Paul Nussbaum updated us on two major projects:
  - There has been further discussion with the BPU and PSE&G regarding connecting our proposed solar panels to the grid. PSEG now says we can connect to the grid as long as our contractor installs equipment to protect the grid from damage. Our solar contractor is working with PSEG to see if this is feasible.
  - The Parlor project is proceeding. Contractors have been selected to do the ceiling replacement, the electrical upgrades and interior renovations. Work should begin within the next several weeks.
- The Communications Committee led by Margot Dark informed us that there is a plan to open the church on some Saturdays to make it available to the public. Two scheduled events in

- town on May 7th make this a good date to start with. We are looking for help to assist between Noon 4 pm that day to pass out water and guide visitors to the Sanctuary
- Caroline Yount, Chair of the Mission Committee talked about our involvement in the National CROP Hunger Walk for Ukraine and asked for support of Session members.
- There was a group discussion about sharing a summary of the Session Meeting Minutes in the Bulletin in this format. We also agreed to periodically publish the names of Committee Chairs and members.

## Called Session Meeting 0n April 25, 2022

- The sole purpose of this meeting was to hear the Finance Committee's insight on how to fund
  the additional costs related to increasing the effective salary of the successful candidate in
  our PNC search. He highlighted that the change will not impact the 2022 Budget. Five
  options were presented. Warren said that we will most likely rely on a combination of these
  options.
- After discussion, a motion was made to increase the salary range we could offer our candidate of choice. The motion passed unanimously.



## ST. WILFRID'S OPEN DOOR CLINIC

This week marks the **106th week** that the Open Door Clinic at St Wilfrid's has distributed food during the pandemic; **128 bags** again, **10,466 total through Saturday. Over 261,650 pounds** of food and dry goods, distributed by the all-volunteer, everything donated Open Door Clinic at St. Wilfrid's. Thank you all for your generous collections and contributions.

**NEEDS:** We are asking for "real food" again this week: white rice, **WHITE RICE**, WHITE RICE. We will be glad to break down large sizes of rice, 10- or 20-pound bags, to smaller quantities to distribute. (Donations of gallon-size Ziploc bags are welcome.) We also are requesting diapers, size 2 and 6. AND WIPES!!!!! Newspaper bags are needed to hold hygiene products. There is also a demand for adult crew socks, black or white. Items may be dropped off weekdays in the St Wilfrid's bin on the steps behind Grace Church, or Sundays at FPC in the alcove between the Parlor and the Sanctuary.

**Food bank Pickup Thank You:** Last Friday, the Foodbank Crew picked up close to 2 ½ tons of food and supplies from the Food Bank of South Jersey and transported it to St. Wilfrid's. It was the largest order we ever picked up. Our drivers, often accompanied by a partner, loaded this order by hand into 9 vehicles and unloaded it in the lower level of St Wilfrid's in just under 90 minutes. That's teamwork!
