Dear Friend,

A Colorful Sunday

This weekend offers all of us some colorful choices:

First — we can wear orange and join together to demand a future free from gun violence once and for all. Why orange? On January 21, 2013, Hadiya Pendleton marched in President Obama's second inaugural parade. One week later, Hadiya was shot and killed on a playground in Chicago. Soon after this tragedy, Hadiya's friends commemorated her life by wearing orange, the color hunters wear in the woods to protect themselves and others. Wear Orange is now observed every June. Thousands of people wear the color orange to honor Hadiya and the more than 40,000 people who are killed with guns and approximately 85,000 who are shot and wounded every year.

Second -- we can wear red in observance of Pentecost, the event depicted in the second chapter of Acts wherein the Holy Spirit appeared to the gathered followers of Jesus following his ascension. It was during that event that God introduced the concept of "Code Switching," the practice of alternating between two or more languages or varieties of language in conversation. This wasn't the reversal of the Tower of Babel, wherein folks couldn't understand each other due to linguistic differences, Pentecost was the occasion of understanding despite differences, in effect, a recognition and celebration of human diversity.

Third -- we can wear a rainbow in recognition of June as LGBTQ+ Pride month. Pride commemorates the Stonewall riots of 1969 and has evolved as the promotion of the self-affirmation, dignity, equality, and increased visibility of lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender (LGBT) people as a social group. Pride, as opposed to shame and social stigma, is the predominant outlook that bolsters most LGBT rights movements. The rainbow flag has been the symbol of Pride since 1978 as colors reflect the diversity of the LGBTQ+ community and the spectrum of human sexuality and gender.



Regardless of what color you decide to wear (or not!) -- I hope to see you on Sunday (in person or streaming) -- and as always, I hope this finds you well.

Vacation Bible School (VBS) for 2022





Over 275,875 pounds** of food and dry goods, distributed by the all-volunteer, everything donated, **nobody gets paid**, Open Door Clinic at St. Wilfrid's.
