Christmas Miracle - #1

A year ago we started talking about a "\$70,000 Problem" which referenced a chronic shortfall in church finances. In response, a task force formed and met for a few months to take a "deep dive" into the revenue and expenses of the congregation and try to craft a balanced budget. That document was presented to Session in September and then dispersed to the committee chairs as a "blueprint to a balanced budget."

They met the challenge and last Monday, Session approved the budget for 2022. Two remarkable things: 1. the budget was approved prior to the start of the year; and 2. it's balanced and sustainable, meaning that no extraordinary funding is required. This is a really impressive accomplishment and will provide the church a template for years ahead.

Here's where you come in:

- Thank an elder! They worked hard and it's nice to be acknowledged for a job well done!
- 2. Pledge. None of this works without your pledge. The leadership of the congregation relies on your continued financial support so please, if you haven't already done so, please do so. Please also consider a special end-of-year gift to the church.

For reference, here's a summary of the budget that has been approved and adopted. A more detailed presentation is planned for the Annual Meeting early in 2022.

ST. WILFRID'S OPEN DOOR CLINIC

This week marks the **90th week out of 91** that the Open Door Clinic at St. Wilfrid's has distributed food during the pandemic; **129 bags** again, **8,694 total. Over 217,350 pounds** of food and dry goods, distributed by the all-volunteer, everything donated, nobody gets paid, Open Door Clinic at St. Wilfrid's. Thank you all for your generous collections and contributions. On Saturday, we distributed **313 toy bags** of 2 and/or 3 toys each to parents to gift their children at Christmas. For most of these children, it will be the only toys they receive. One woman started the line at 4:00 am so she wouldn't miss out. And many thanks to the high school youth who helped carry bags to cars, and who ran into the sanctuary to collect for the different ages.

- Coats: As we enter this holiday season, please be on the lookout for coats, gently used or new, sizes 24 months to XXL. These may be dropped off in the alcove behind the parlor. (Check out Walmart, Boscov, Costco and BJ's). And there seems to be a desire for "puffy coats." Last Friday at Costco Cherry Hill, there were "puffy jackets" selling for under \$20.00.
