# **Opponent or Enemy?**

Senator Bob Dole is lying in state this morning in the Capitol and in light of his recent death, NPR is replaying an interview from 2005 in which Dole reflects on his recovery from war injuries and his years in Congress. One small distinction caught my ear. In speaking of those on the "other side of the aisle" he was careful to say, "they were opponents, not enemies"

It clicked. In much of our social and political discourse and discord we've conflated the two.

**Opponent**: someone who competes against or fights another in a contest, game, or argument; a rival or adversary.

**Enemy**: a person who is actively opposed or hostile to someone or something.



There's a clear line between the two: one is a contest between rivals and the other is open and active hostility. One seems to address a dispute over ideas or practices, the other is contempt for a person.

This isn't to uphold Senator Dole as any sort of icon but rather to say that I applaud his service and civility (even if mostly aspirational for most of us). His words also prompt consideration of how we treat or view those with whom we disagree. Are they opponents or enemies?

We know how Jesus felt about our enemies.

Food for thought.

In other news:

A church in Baltimore Presbytery recently had a significant outbreak among its Sunday morning worshipers with 10% testing positive and some with symptoms. It was reported that the congregation was mostly vaccinated and had relaxed masking and other guidelines. The church has now closed for 14 days and is implementing a sanitizing protocol while programming and worship is moved online.



As we head into our "busy season" with higher anticipated attendance, we're paying very close attention to capacity and COVID restrictions, namely, that every adult entering the building must be fully vaccinated and remain masked during services, in groups, or when children are present. In addition, to monitor limited capacity, we are counting out 350 bulletins for the Advent Candlelight this

Sunday and the 10:00 p.m. Christmas Eve service. When those have been handed out, folks will be offered seating in Fellowship Hall where the services will be streamed and projected.

The church is committed to safety and staying open -- full vaccination equals full participation.

# ST. WILFRID'S OPEN DOOR CLINIC

This week marks the **89th week out of 90** that the Open Door Clinic at St. Wilfrid's has distributed food during the pandemic; **111 bags, 8,565 total. Over 214,125 pounds** of food and dry goods! Thank you all for your generous contributions. In addition to the food bags, 100 hygiene bags for men, 100 hygiene bags for women, and 250 makeup bags for teenagers were filled by Corey Crumley and given out! Oh, the joy on our clients' faces! Please note, we will not be open on Saturday, December 25, or Saturday, January 1, so we need some extra things prior to those dates: **NEEDS**:

- Food bank pickup: extra help is needed on Friday, December 17. Please check in with Paul at umanpaul@me.com if you can help transport food to St Wilfrid's on 12/17.
- Coats: As we enter this holiday season, please be on the lookout for coats, gently used or new, sizes from 24 months to 2XL; also sweatshirts and sweatpants, socks, hats, scarves, mittens, and gloves. Those without homes of course need these items, but so do people who rent but live in frigid apartments they live in their jackets and coats when home. These items may be left in the alcove behind the parlor on the coat rack.
- Food and Hygiene: Needs are spaghetti sauce, instant oatmeal packets, diapers size 6, baby wipes and more baby wipes! And of course plastic grocery bags from Shoprite and Wegman's, paper grocery bags to line the plastic bags, and newspaper bags to hold hygiene products. These items may be dropped off weekdays in the bin on the steps of Grace Episcopal Church PATCO side or Sundays in the alcove of our church between the parlor and the sanctuary. Thank you for caring!
