Chopped Spinach

In 1924, Clarence Birdseye, a Canadian fur trader, discovered that fish that was frozen immediately after being caught was just as delicious as fresh caught even if defrosted a month later. In short order, he developed a system for flash-freezing meats and vegetables and soon those cold bricks of nutritious greens were in grocery freezers from coast to coast.

As a kid, I thought all vegetables came in frozen blocks that were neatly stacked in our frosty freezer. While preparing dinner, whichever one was next up would be peeled from its waxed paper package and tossed in a saucepan with enough water to help with defrosting. Then, the slotted spoon would portion the watery vegetables onto our plates.



My brother and I dreaded chopped spinach night.



It was always in the rotation so it showed up every week without fail. Why couldn't we have sweet, buttery, delicious corn every night? But no — spinach was nutritious and good for us — just ask Popeye.

The fact that it was chock full of vitamins and nutrients made little impression on us. It tasted gross and had a texture to match which, together, made it wholly hard to swallow.

It was nearly a visceral response this week when I read a Bible commentator refer to Jesus' teaching about loving enemies, and turning the other cheek, and no judging or condemning as the "chopped spinach of the Bible!" It's good for us but no one really wants to dig in. It goes down hard no matter how it's served. Life would be so much easier if Jesus had just left this off the menu!

Here's the text from Luke 6:

"But I [Jesus] say to you that listen, Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you. If anyone strikes you on the cheek, offer the other also; and from anyone who takes away your coat do not withhold even your shirt. Give to everyone who begs from you; and if anyone takes away your goods, do not ask for them again. Do to others as you would have them do to you.

"Do not judge, and you will not be judged; do not condemn, and you will not be condemned. Forgive, and you will be forgiven; give, and it will be given to you."

Of all of the teachings of Jesus — these have to be the hardest — and among the most controversial.

On one hand, they comprise an ethic of generosity for Christians living in an inhospitable world. They offer a challenge to a very high standard. Yet do they promote compliance and perpetual abuse or are they components of resistance in the face of evil?

Just like that portion of chopped spinach, we may not like it, wish it wasn't there, but it's nevertheless good for us and so we'll chew on it together Sunday morning.

Until then — here's a clue: Christ in the world changes the way we see each other — at least it should!



Over 232,025 pounds** of food and dry goods, distributed by the all-volunteer, everything-donated, **nobody-gets-paid**, Open Door Clinic at St. Wilfrid's. Thank you all for your generous collections and contributions.

Foodbank: The foodbank crew will be picking up at the SJ Foodbank on Friday **February 25** at a little after 8:00 a.m., and then to St. Wilfrid's starting at 8:35 or so. After February 25, the next foodbank pick-up in March. Please contact Paul at umanpaul@me.com if you can help transport food to St Wilfrid's. ALWAYS can use more help with pickup!!!

NEEDS: Canned tuna, white rice, spaghetti sauce in plastic jar or can, diapers (sizes 2 and 6), wipes and more wipes, and toothbrushes. And always plastic grocery bags from Shoprite or Wegman's, paper grocery bags to line the plastic bags, and newspaper bags to hold hygiene products. These may be dropped off in the alcove between the Parlor and the Sanctuary or in the bin on the steps behind Grace Church on the PATCO side on weekdays.

Coats: We are still giving out coats (adult sizes), mittens or gloves, scarves, and sweatshirts for all ages as long as there is a need and supply. They may be dropped off in the bin on the steps of Grace Church on the PATCO side on weekdays or on Corey Crumley's front porch: 40 Warwick Rd, Haddonfield.
