The Back Cast!

The key to fly fishing is the back cast.

Fly fishing, the most elegant of angling pursuits, challenges the fisher to fling a feather-light insect-look-alike through the air and land it on moving water such that a trout or bass finds it irresistible and lunges for it — hopefully with such force that it is airborne.



There's no bait, no weight, no bobbers,

no lures, nothing of any significant substance at the end of the line which is engineered to float on the surface of the water. Positioning the fly properly requires a skillful back cast.

How the line is flung backwards and then flicked forward determines its trajectory — its speed and direction — and ultimately how effective the cast will be in catching a finicky trout!

As part of the 150th Anniversary, the Communications Committee is working on its back cast by interviewing a small group of long-term, actively engaged members. So far, I've completed four of my assigned interviews and the purpose is not a "walk down memory lane" but much more toward how does First Presbyterian's past help form the trajectory of its future. That's done by trying to identify some common threads — strengths and otherwise — and extrapolating to the future — both immediate and longterm.

It's been an enlightening experience!



Any number of common threads have arisen and you'll hear about those in a future article (not all interviews have been completed and I don't want to influence those!) but everyone's input is welcome. What consistencies have you seen (don't have to be all positive!) at the church in your time? Send me a <u>note</u> and we'll include your thoughts when the committee reports back to the congregation. Even without that — just take a moment and think back on your life — what's the back cast and how has it propelled or placed you where you are today? Think about how the slightest change in velocity or trajectory could have altered the course of your lives.

However it happened — so glad we all ended up on 20 Kings Highway for these couple of years!





April is the national observation of Child Abuse Prevention Month. During this time, Presbyterian Women and the children of the church "plant" a Pinwheel Garden to call attention to the efforts of Prevent Child Abuse-NJ to create safe environments for all children. The pinwheel was chosen as a national symbol of prevention because it is whimsical and evokes childlike notions – so it is a good emblem of the "Great Childhoods" they desire for all children. Founded in 1979 Prevent Child Abuse-New Jersev (PCA-NJ) promotes Great Childhoods, positive

parenting, and healthy child development. Annually, PCA-NJ's programs and services reach more than 50,000 children and families statewide and is the New Jersey Chapter of Prevent Child Abuse America, a network of chapters in all 50 states.
