## Two Blind Brothers

I'm not really sure where I first read about the Two Blind Brothers [website](#) and story — it could have been on [Wirecutter](#) where I seem to spend a lot (too much?) time — regardless, I was immediately intrigued at the thought of "shopping blind."

First of all, here are the [brothers](#):



Founders and brothers Bryan Manning and Bradford Manning are the Two Blind Brothers. They grew up in Virginia and currently live together in New York City. They are equally obsessed about the way clothing feels, and they are ruthlessly committed to finding cures for blindness. At a young age, they were both diagnosed with [Stargardt](#) disease, which is a form of macular degeneration.

They have small business selling some of the nicest/softest/well-made clothing, and all of the profits go to curing blindness.

One fun aspect of their business is the concept of "shopping blind!" In short, you pick one of the three price points, send money, and wait to see what comes! No idea what you're getting — and you don't even get to look at their catalog! Totally blind!

I picked the \$69 level and my package arrived in Wilmington earlier this week while I was in Haddonfield. I was really excited to see what I got!

A [knit cap](#), a [scarf](#), and a pair of [socks](#)! (I've connected links to the items on their website so you can read a complete description including the faux-leather braille sewn on each!)



Lastly, an excerpt from the letter than accompanied my order:

***When someone shops blind, they prove something remarkable. They prove that genuine trust is real. They prove that they not only care about what a company sells but also what it stands for. They prove that when you face a challenge, you should embrace it. You are that person. In this way, the Shop Blind Challenge has helped us filter for the best people that any clothing brand or mission could ever hope to find.***

*So, what comes in your order?*

*The products you're holding right now are quite special. The strength of this community has allowed Two Blind Brothers to work with the world's best materials, fabrics, and production facilities. As soon as you touch the items, you'll know it for yourself.*

*We're lucky to have a team and group of partners from former luxury brands who are willing to produce these items for the sake of our charitable mission. In addition, we've been able to work with visually-impaired production teams like Industries for the Blind. You'll also notice a special detail--we try to incorporate a subtle braille word or message into all of our designs, as a way to honor our cause.*

It's Stewardship Season at FPCH and so we're going to talk about money on Sunday — more to the point — how we get it and how we give it away and what role does faith play in any of that? I think it's true that for most of us, the most accurate statement of faith is our checkbook (or Quicken account!). How we spend our money really does speak to what matters to us. How much do we give away? What "strings" are attached? Are we "cheerful givers?" What causes prompt us to open our wallets? Do we expect anything in return - recognition? swag? influence?

Are we capable of "giving blind?"

## The Goal and the Challenge: A Message from the Stewardship Committee

Dear Family of Faith:

It goes without saying that 2020 has greatly impacted all aspects of our lives including how we engage with and continue the work of the church. The resilience and perseverance that has been exhibited in continuing to fulfill the church's mission has been extraordinary. For this reason, Run with Perseverance is the theme of the stewardship campaign. Thanks to all the members and staff who have provided their unique messages related to our church family during campaign. It was not only great to see your faces but also hear the stories and their relevance to the collective financial support of the congregation. (Watch a video from the Hurd family below.)



As we move to the pledging phase of this year's stewardship campaign, we feel it is appropriate to clearly articulate the overall goals.

The Goal: In articulating the goal, it is important for the congregation to understand what may be a little-known fact. For each year from 2015 through 2020, the number of pledging units and total dollars pledged has declined as shown in the table below.

The goal for this campaign is to build back and achieve 2015 levels of giving in terms of number of pledges and total dollars. While the goal may not be achieved this year, we need this year to be the year we as a congregation reverse the trend of decline and work toward achieving the 2015 levels. The Challenge: Here's what you can do to help. Below is a three-prong challenge for you to consider for increasing your pledge and contributing to achieving the goal.

We are asking you to consider an increase in your pledge applying the formula below (1, 2 or 3) that would result in the greatest increase.

1. Increase your pledge to the church average of \$3,150 for the coming year;
2. Increase your pledge by 1% of your gross income; or
3. Increase your pledge by \$500 for the year.

We certainly know these times are incredibly difficult and you simply may not be able to meet this challenge at any level. But if you are able, we would greatly appreciate it if you would prayerfully consider increasing your financial support, if not at the greatest level outlined above, at a level with which you have comfort.

To those members who consistently support the church financially but choose not to pledge, please know that your contribution is vital to life of the church and we would ask those members to consider the challenge above whether or not it includes a formal pledge.

We will be providing the congregation with weekly updates on the number of pledges and total amount versus the stated goals.

Your time and attention to all of the information provided through the email newsletters, bulletins and services is very much appreciated and we certainly welcome any feedback on any aspect of the campaign. 



## ST. WILFRID'S OPEN DOOR CLINIC

### Report from the Open Door Clinic

**Food Donation:** On Tuesday, we were alerted to a large donation of food at the bin:

"it's overflowing." An overreaction: it wasn't. But the bin was pretty full of donated food: well over 300 cans of vegetables, 16 boxes of cereal, instant mashed potatoes, rice, peanut butter, tuna. And there were labels: Bishop Eustace Boys and Girls Cross Country Team. Very generous. We have emailed the athletic department thanks, but if anyone know more, please let us know. A wonderful gesture from some wonderful youth. That's a full day...thinking of others.



November 14, we distributed **108 food bags**. This was the **35th** straight week of the pandemic that we have distributed food which you have supplied us: **3,037 bags** or well over 75,000 pounds of food and dry goods. Thank you for your humble service- you are the best.

As you can see, we had extra donations last week but we use them up quickly so still need peanut butter, tuna, pasta, sauce, diapers (2's, 4's, 6's and adult medium and large) AND.....Socks for all ages and clean winter coats or jackets-all sizes but especially for men. OR gift cards from Shoprite or Aldi's can always be used! These may be dropped off after church on Sundays at the Drive Through (11-12) or any weekday in the bin behind Grace Church. Thanks SO much!

One of the woman who lived in the fire damaged apartment building at 3416 Cramer St appeared for food Saturday. We had a backpack made up with women's jeans, and new underwear, new socks, shirts, and toiletries ready to go. Thank you for helping us help.
