The Goal and the Challenge: A Message from the Stewardship Committee

Dear Family of Faith:

It goes without saying that 2020 has greatly impacted all aspects of our lives including how we engage with and continue the work of the church. The resilience and perseverance that has been exhibited in continuing to fulfill the church's mission has been extraordinary. For this reason, Run with Perseverance is the theme of the stewardship campaign. Thanks to all the members and staff who have provided their unique messages related to our church family during campaign. It was not only great to see your faces but also hear the stories and



their relevance to the collective financial support of the congregation. (Watch a video from the Skey family below.)

As we move to the pledging phase of this year's stewardship campaign, we feel it is appropriate to clearly articulate the overall goals.

The Goal: In articulating the goal, it is important for the congregation to understand what may be a littleknown fact. For each year from 2015 through 2020, the number of pledging units and total dollars pledged has declined as shown in the table below.

The goal for this campaign is to build back and achieve 2015 levels of giving in terms of number of pledges and total dollars. While the goal may not be achieved this year, we need this year to be the year we as a congregation reverse the trend of decline and work toward achieving the 2015 levels.

The Challenge: Here's what you can do to help. Below is a three-prong challenge for you to consider for increasing your pledge and contributing to achieving the goal.

We are asking you to consider an increase in your pledge applying the formula below (1, 2 or 3) that would result in the greatest increase:

- 1. Increase your pledge to the church average of \$3,150 for the coming year;
- 2. Increase your pledge by 1% of your gross income; or
- 3. Increase your pledge by \$500 for the year.

We certainly know these times are incredibly difficult and you simply may not be able to meet this challenge at any level. But if you are able, we would greatly appreciate it if you would prayerfully consider increasing your financial support, if not at the greatest level outlined above, at a level with which you have comfort.

To those members who consistently support the church financially but choose not to pledge, please know that your contribution is vital to life of the church and we would ask those members to consider the challenge above whether or not it includes a formal pledge.

We will be providing the congregation with weekly updates on the number of pledges and total amount versus the stated goals.

Your time and attention to all of the information provided through the email newsletters, bulletins and services is very much appreciated and we certainly welcome any feedback on any aspect of the campaign. They have gone above and beyond week after week to provide a fun and engaging unique preschool experience for our little learners!


WELCOME NEW MEMBERS - INCLUDING THE LITTLEST!

Report from the Open Door Clinic at St Wilfrid's November 23, 2020

On September 21, we reported about the pregnant woman waiting for food, in line at St Wilfrid's, going into labor, and rushing off to the hospital. Saturday, we met Alaya, born October 28, 2020, an American citizen. She is perfectly and wonderfully made. Pray for Alaya, that she has good health, safety, and good fortune. We are truly thankful for seeing Alaya.

This week marks the 26th straight week that the Open Door Clinic at St Wilfrid's has distributed food during the



pandemic; 114 bags, 3,151 total. Over 78,000 pounds of food and dry goods given out!

Needed... We are collecting CLEAN winter jackets and new socks. Diapers: sizes 2, 4. 5. 6, and wipes. Blankets And-always peanut butter, tuna, pasta, sauce, macaroni n cheese are needed

December 12th we will be distributing Christmas gifts for our clients' children. Help will be needed to translate, show parents what is available, and to go inside to get the gifts chosen. We are working from outside.
