

THE OPEN DOOR CLINIC AT ST. WILFRID'S

This is the **85th straight week** that the Open Door Clinic at St. Wilfrid's has distributed food during the pandemic: **111 bags**, **8,076 total**. **Over 201,900 pounds** of food and dry goods, distributed by the all-volunteer, everything-donated, nobody-gets-paid Open Door Clinic at St. Wilfrid's. In October, we distributed 556 food bags over the 5 Saturday period. Thank you for your generous donations!

NEEDS: We need **baby wipes** and more wipes, canned fruit, pasta, and sauce AND plastic grocery bags from Wegman's or Shoprite, paper grocery bags to line the plastic bags, and newspaper bags to hold hygiene products These items may be dropped off weekdays in the bin on the steps of the PATCO side of Grace Episcopal Church or on Sundays in the alcove between the parlor and the sanctuary. Mark Hall will retrieve donations outside the church by the office door immediately following worship. **Winter coats and jackets, mittens, hats, and scarves, and sweatshirts for all ages** may be dropped off in the alcove behind the Parlor. Many of our clients are either homeless or live in rental apartments where the heat is controlled by the owner and set at 55 degrees. They leave the oven door open and layer up or wrap blankets around themselves to stay warm. Winter wear is welcome!
