On May 30th the church will commence modified and CDC-compliant in-person worship in Fellowship Hall. It's a step, perhaps a big one, to returning to the sanctuary in September.

Yes, there's a growing sense of openness; but I have specifically avoided the word "normal." We're *not* going back to "normal" — too much has changed, we've lost too many people, and our lives have been inextricably changed. To return to "normal" means everything's all better. And it's not.

Moving forward — changed, altered, resilient — that's what we're doing. We're moving forward the best that we can in the still-present ethos of a disease that ravaged our society and community — to say nothing of the families who are emerging from the pandemic without loved ones.

Yes, there's a change and it's palpable and it's all around and it even feels good — but it's not a return to normal — it's a tentative step into a future that is markedly different from just 16 months ago.

Markedly different in all ways but one way:

For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

God is good. God will provide.

ST. WILFRID'S OPEN DOOR CLINIC

The Report of the Open Door Clinic at St Wilfrid's May 3, 2021:

The "Baseball Reference" chronicles the professional baseball history of the forty-one-year-old pitcher who lines up for a food bag weekly at St. Wilfrid's: Julio Guerrero was 19 years old from the Dominican Republic when he entered the Pittsburgh Pirates organization in the year 2000. From 2000 to 2005, he pitched for the Pirate organization in places like Hickory, NC, Williamsport PA, Lynchburg VA, and had his best year at age 24 with a 11-5 record in 129 innings, striking out 78 and walking 23. Apparently, the Pirates lost interest in Julio and appear to have released him after that year. He then tried to catch on through pitching in independent leagues for teams in Long Island, the Camden Riversharks, and the Netanya Tigers of the Israel Baseball League. His professional career ended in 2010. At St. Wilfrid's we know Julio only as a tall, good looking, soft-spoken man. Imagine being a teen, leaving your homeland to seek a profession in a foreign land, different culture, different language, in Hickory, or Williamsport or Israel? Julio never speaks of his baseball past. He is humble. He is friendly. He smiles. He's grateful. The Open Door Clinic seeks to help all in need each Saturday. Sometimes they are past professional baseball players.

This week marks the **59th straight week** that the Open-Door Clinic at St Wilfrid's has distributed food during the pandemic: **86 bags**, **5,480 total**, **over 137,000 pounds** of food and dry goods. Thank you all for your generous collections and contributions.

Needs: Rice, pasta, macaroni and cheese, applesauce, toothpaste, and bars of soap plastic grocery bags from Shoprite or Wegman's, paper grocery bags to line the plastic bags, and newspaper bags to hold hygiene products. We are starting to collect box fans as the temperature rises AND to collect backpacks to give out when school starts again in September. We estimate needing 75 backpacks These items may be dropped off in the bins behind Grace Episcopal Church on weekdays or on Sundays at the drive-through after church from 11-12. 
