Catching up on a few things!



One of the things we've really tried to do the past year is to improve communication with the congregation and one means of doing that has been this weekly email. While the typical format has been a short note at the beginning, today I'm going to catch folks up on a few projects and changes.

COVID Restrictions Relaxed. In light of Governor Murphy's lifting of restrictions based on vaccination rates, Session has made the following changes to the COVID guidelines for worship: masks are no longer required for those who have been fully vaccinated; worship will now include singing once children have left the service—singing of the second hymn is permitted, though humming is also encouraged:

chairs will be set up with space between them, but strict social distancing requirements are relaxed. We will continue to show appropriate caution while applauding the progress this represents.

Mission Study Completed. Session has approved the recently updated Mission Study and, after completing a few edits, the report will be sent to the presbytery for approval. Concurrent with that, it will be made available to the congregation. The next step is to convene the Nominating Committee and eventually propose a slate for the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) to be voted upon at a Congregational Meeting. 
Principal Organist Hired. It is with great joy that the Organist Search Committee announces the end of its work! Our new Principal Organist, Lucas Brown, will be joining us on our first day back in the sanctuary in September to lead worship. We'll save a full biographical description for that special day, but for now: Lucas is a graduate of Temple University and Westminster Choir College, where he studied both jazz organ and classical organ, respectively. We are very excited by his hymn-leading ability, the new repertoire he brings, his ability to improvise, and the musical doors he will open up to us with his jazz background. Many thanks to the members of the search committee, and also to everyone who helped us to find and vet our candidates. We feel confident in our decision and blessed by God's answer to our prayer!

Budget Task Force Commences Work. A group was assembled last month to figure out ways to close the \$50,000 to \$70,000 gap in our annual finances. The task force, which is composed of Caroline Yount, Corey Crumley, Jim Hoobler, Lisa Hurd, Lois Boyce, Margot Dark, Paul Urian, and Warren Pross, are examining ways to increase revenue, reduce expenses, and generally bring as much fiscal efficiency as possible to the church's financial health. They are working toward the goal of presenting their findings and recommendations to Session in the early fall in time for the budget process of 2022. It's important to address this ongoing issue prior to calling a new Pastor/Head of Staff. (cont.)




YOU CAN STILL JOIN NIKKI'S BOOK STUDY




CONVERSATION ON RACE MEETS IN PERSON

ST. WILFRID'S OPEN DOOR CLINIC

One of our frequent clients died last week. Sammy lived in the apartment complex on Cramer Street that burned down few months ago. He was disabled. Housing was found and thankfully not in a shelter where, as Sammy said, "all the druggies are." He was bilingual and often helped translate for other clients. Our clients care about each other. Please pray for Sammy's clinic family He will be missed!!!

This week marks the **66th straight week** that the Open-Door Clinic at St Wilfrid's has distributed food during the pandemic: **108 bags**, **6,1113 total**. **Over 152,775 pounds** of food and dry goods have been distributed by the all-volunteer, everything-donated, nobody-gets-paid Open Door Clinic at St. Wilfrid's. Contributions other than from the foodbank, allow us to feed everyone; thank you.

NEEDS: canned veggies and fruit, tuna, large and extra-large adult diapers, and wipes. (We received large donation of baby diapers so are okay with them this week). **Also needed:** plastic grocery bags from Shoprite and Wegman's, paper grocery bags to line the plastic bags, and newspaper bags to hold hygiene products. These may be dropped off weekdays in the bin behind Grace Church on the left marked St. Wilfrid's or on Sundays at FPC on the table outside Fellowship Hall or the table outside the church by the door to office on the Masonic Temple side. **Food Bank pickup help** is needed on Fridays – especially since some of the regulars need a day off to visit family or take a vacation this summer...if you might be able to help, please email Rose Guthrie at intrepidrose@hotmail.com.
