

What do Jeopardy! and First Presbyterian of Haddonfield have in common?

If you're a regular viewer of the greatest game show ever aired on television, you'll know that long-term host, Alex Trebek, died in November of 2020 after hosting Jeopardy! for 37 seasons. He was, in essence, synonymous with the show as an entire generation had only seen Alex host. (You can date yourself if you remember Art Fleming!)

Alas, the "real" host has yet to be named and a series of "guest hosts" have subbed for two-week stretches. The three pictured above garnered the highest ratings yet there are many more to try out! (Here's a complete listing of past, present, and future hosts.) The show's producer recently hinted that a permanent replacement may be named later in the summer.

Why so many subs? Why not just hire one and move on? Alex was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer two years before he died, surely that was enough time to quietly scope out a new host. Here's what Mike Richards, the producer, said in explanation of the delay:

"We started talking about it internally that to name someone right away would be very hard for us because we were still reeling from the loss," said Richards. "If on Friday it's Alex's last show and then Monday it's a new person's show, that would probably be unfair to the person stepping in to do it."

That sentence captures much of why FPCH has a Transitional Pastor: In the long run, undergoing this time of a "long-term sub" is really for the person you call to be your next "real" Pastor/Head of Staff. A typical interim time is two years and no one really knows yet what the effect of the pandemic has on that average, but regardless, the church is on schedule.

From this "guest host" I can only convey my gratitude that God saw fit for me to cross the Delaware and serve among some truly lovely and faithful Presbyterians in Haddonfield, New Jersey!


AUGUST WORKSHOPS ON VISITATION AND PRAYER

ST. WILFRID'S OPEN DOOR CLINIC

This week marks the 67th straight week that the Open Door Clinic at St Wilfrid's has distributed food during the pandemic: 87 bags this week, 6,200 total. Over 155,000 pounds of food and dry goods have been distributed by the all-volunteer, everything-donated, nobody-gets-paid Open Door Clinic. Thank you all for your generous collections and contributions.

Needs: Canned fruits and veggies, applesauce, adult diapers—large and extra-large, wipes, toothbrushes, toothpaste, soap, deodorant, and always plastic grocery bags from Shoprite or Wegman's, paper grocery bags to line the plastic bags, and newspaper bags to hold hygiene products. All items may be dropped off weekdays in the St Wilfrid's bin behind Grace Church and on Sundays on the table outside FPC Fellowship Hall or on the table outside the door to the offices of the church. Box fans are greatly needed and may be dropped off or sent to Corey Crumley at 40 Warwick Rd., Haddonfield. Help is needed with foodbank pickup and drop off on July 9 and July 16.
