Dear Friend,

We Will Never Forget

Everyone older than five years remembers where they were on September 11, 2001.

For Americans, it is a date that "lives in infamy" in the constellation of milestones in our country's history. There was a ubiquitous fear of "what's next?" We wondered if our homeland would ever be safe and secure again. The Homeland Security Act of 2002 was introduced in the aftermath of the September 11 attacks and subsequent mailings of anthrax spores. The HSA was cosponsored by 118 members of Congress. The act passed the U.S. Senate by a vote of 90–9, with one Senator not voting.



The HSA is proof of the lengths we will go to ensure our safety and "way of life." Americans abdicated wide swaths of freedom for enhanced security and have learned to live with daily restrictions in travel and communication.

Today the biggest threat to the American way of life isn't a terrorist group or a maniacal dictator or a wave of immigration - no - the biggest threat to our well-being today is an unseen and easily transmittable virus.

Here's the sad irony: we have an iron-clad, scientifically proven, and government approved defense. Vaccination. That's it. A vaccine that's administered with one or two shots which are no more complicated or painful than one to ward off the flu.

Yet a statistically significant number of American adults refuse to take it, and in doing so, put the rest of our community, and in growing numbers our children, at risk of a fatal disease.

September 11th ... a day to remember that to be safe we all have to do our part.

WELCOME, LUCAS BROWN!



This coming Sunday, Lucas begins his official duties as the new Principal Organist. Lucas is a performing artist, composer and educator. He actively performs both Jazz and classical music and has performed around the US and Canada at such venues as Carnegie Hall, the Kimmel Center, the Jazz Standard and the Blue Note, as well as in Europe and Asia. His compositions have been presented throughout the US and Europe. A member of the faculty at Temple University's Esther Boyer College of Music, Lucas holds a BM in Jazz Performance from Temple University and a MM in Organ Performance from Westminster Choir College.

Lucas was a member of saxophone legend Bootsie Barnes' organ trio from the age of 21. He has performed with such Jazz artists as Joey DeFrancesco, Pat Martino, Eric Alexander, Terell Stafford, and Gerald Veasley, and is a sideman on numerous recordings. He was awarded the Clef Club Jazz Award in 2014 in recognition of his contributions as an organist in Philadelphia. Lucas was a member of the Pennsylvania Performing Arts on Tour (PennPAT) artist roster as a member of the group Three Blind Mice, with Victor North and Wayne Smith Jr. Lucas has also performed with Opera Philadelphia and the Philadelphia Orchestra. Lucas is currently touring with the Joey DeFrancesco trio and is featured on Joey's upcoming album, *More Music*, to be released in September of 2021.

Lucas maintains a busy performance schedule on the Jazz scene and recently began serving as organist at the First Presbyterian Church of Haddonfield, NJ. He also serves at historic Christ Church in Philadelphia, accompanying their monthly choral vespers series. Previously, Lucas spent over a decade at Mt. Airy Presbyterian in Philadelphia. He earned his Master's degree in Organ Performance at Westminster Choir College as a student of Alan Morrison and is an active member of the Philadelphia Chapter of the American Guild of Organists and, sitting on the program committee. He has twice been a featured artist at Organ Day at the Kimmel Center.

Lucas has had his works as a composer performed at such venues as Grimsby Minster (UK), Torino Esposizioni in Italy, Movement Research at the Judson Church in NYC, and Taubman Museum of Art in Roanoke. Lucas' Jazz suite, SkyViews, was commissioned by the Kimmel Center for the Performing Arts for a premiere performance in 2019 and his album, *Skyviews*, was released in November 2019. Lucas was commissioned in 2014 to premiere a new composition as part of "If You Could Hear These Walls", a collaborative project sponsored by Philadelphia Mural Arts and the American Composers Forum. He collaborates frequently with choreographer and media artist, Jung-eun Kim.


CHILDREN'S AND YOUTH CHOIR REHEARSALS BEGIN ON SEPT. 15

HELP FOR AFGHAN REFUGEES

First Presbyterian Haddonfield is supporting the efforts of sister church First Presbyterian Bordentown in helping refugees arriving at Joint Base McGuire-Fort Dix-Lakehurst. Debby Brincivalli, Executive Presbyter, has asked all of the churches in the Presbytery for South Jersey to assist. She shared this letter from Bordentown's mission coordinator:

Dear Friends,

I'm reaching out on behalf of the Mission Commission at the First Presbyterian Church in Bordentown. Over the weekend [Aug. 28-29] we were contacted by a logistics officer at Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst. He wanted to know if we would be interested in collecting needed items and functioning as a contact point for receiving those items for the Afghan refugees temporarily residing there. Of course we jumped at the opportunity! We hope you will join us in this ministry of hospitality and welcoming the stranger. Please distribute this information in whatever way(s) are appropriate in your churches with as robust an invitation to participate as you can! Here are the ways to participate:

- Purchase needed items [see lists on <u>the Mission page of FPCH's website</u>] and deliver them to our Church Office (address in next bullet) at any of the dates and times listed. Please do not leave items on the porch at other times as they would face an uncertain future!
- Donate money by writing a check to "First Presbyterian Church-Bordentown" and writing "Afghan Refugees" in the memo line, and either mailing it in (435 Farnsworth Avenue, Bordentown, NJ 08505-2004) or dropping it in the mail slot of the Church Office at that address. We will use 100% of every donation to purchase items from the list.
